**Where to park:** Parking is available on all sides of the facility.

**The scoop on poop:** Please give your dog a chance to use the bathroom. Car rides can be stimulating for dogs. Poop bags are available by the small trash can located by the back door, by the small trash can located out front by the first parking spot, or inside the building on the front counter to your left just as you enter.

**What to bring:** Fresh water, treats, toys, blow dryer and towels are provided. You don't really have to bring much except for your dog.

To assure safety, you will want to have your dog on leash coming and going. *Please do not feed your dog 2-3 hours before their session.*

**The reception area:** You are always welcome to arrive early before your session and enjoy our relaxing reception area. Keeping your pup on a leash, enjoy our comfy chairs, play with a puzzle, or enjoy a beverage.

**Relax, enjoy your dog and I will come for you as soon as the previous client has left the pool room.**

**What to expect in your first session:**

The first session is all about having your pup feel emotionally secure and safe. Usually after our initial greeting, (which usually includes cookies and belly rubs) I will pick up your dog, slowly get them onto the first step and carry them into the water. While sitting on the stairs together I will begin some bodywork work. The sessions of canine warm water exercise will usually be a combination of warm water bodywork, and swimming. It will all depend on your friend's condition, circumstances and your goals.

**How often should you come for water therapy?**

The answer to this question will depend on many variables. We will be talking about this during our first session together and will map out a plan to accommodate your needs.

**Payment Method:** Cash, Check, Visa, MasterCard, American Express and Discover

**Note:** Please brush your dog before their swim session to help get rid of hair and debris. If the dog is really dirty or has any skin or hair medication on them, please rinse them off. The spa should not be used as their bath time.

There will be hairbrushes available in the waiting room if you need to brush your dog. Please throw loose dog hair in the trash can in the waiting room.
